Communicating Student Learning: Term 1

Schools in Burnaby, and across the province, are participating in a pilot for communicating student learning in the first term of the 2020-2021 school year. The pilot meets the BC Ministry of Education reporting guidelines, achieves the goal of communicating learning so that parents are well informed of their child's progress, and addresses the challenges of this unusual first term.

In lieu of the typical first term report card, Lakeview students will receive a Snapshot of Learning. The Snapshot of Learning will have many of the components of a regular report card, however, this informal interim report will focus primarily on the [Core Competencies of the BC Curriculum](#), which are foundational to all provincial curricula and to the development of the educated citizen.

The Snapshot of Learning will include:

- teacher feedback on your child's communication, social responsibility and personal awareness
- teacher feedback on your child's strengths in relation to grade level learning standards
- teacher feedback on areas for further development and ways to support your child at home

One difference to note between the Snapshot of Student Learning and a regular report card is that the Snapshot will focus on only prioritized learning standards in Language Arts and Numeracy. The proficiency scale ratings (emerging, developing, proficient, extending) will be provided for these prioritized learning standards but not all academic areas as these will be included on the first regular report card. Should a teacher have concerns with how your child is progressing academically, they will reach out to speak with you directly. Alternatively, parents always have the option of contacting their child's teacher with questions or to discuss concerns.

The first term of this school year has undoubtedly been like none we have seen

before. The students have adjusted well with the changes and challenges, especially considering many of them were learning at home from March to September. Unfortunately, many students have missed a fair bit of school, either from doing the right thing and staying home when feeling unwell, or from transitioning back to school from other learning options on a biweekly basis. It has also taken longer to settle into the routines of school with the new health and safety protocols in place.

The Snapshot of Learning reporting pilot addresses the impact of the unusual start to the school year, while simultaneously communicating information about students' intellectual, personal, and social and emotional proficiencies. The reporting process will engage students in meaningful conversations that extend their learning and progress. Additionally, the format allows for parents to be involved in a dialogue about their child's progress and the best ways to support and extend their child's learning.
