Winter Weather:

With winter weather almost here, we want to remind you about how the Burnaby School District shares weather-related school closures.

All schools will remain OPEN, unless there is heavy snowfall, damage or other circumstances such as a power outage – that make it impossible to open for instruction. The District will do its best to communicate school or district-wide closures on our website by 6:30 am. However, please keep in mind that there may be situations where this is not possible – again, such as a power outage.

Sidewalks on 6th Street

Sonny Senghera started this petition to City of Burnaby 6th Street - between Burris Street and Reigate Road - is an incredibly dangerous stretch of road for pedestrians and cyclists. There are no sidewalks and street lights are woefully inadequate. As a result, pedestrians must walk on the road, with cars speeding by within inches of them. This road has only gotten worse as traffic bypasses Canada Way. It's not uncommon for pedestrians to have to jump out of the way to avoid being struck by a driver that can't see them in the dark. It's also the main corridor for children in the neighborhood walk to and from Lakeview Elementary. Neighborhood residents have been asking the City for sidewalks on 6th Street for over 40 years and we shouldn't wait for a child to be struck or killed. This needs to made into a City priority. Please join this petition to make our neighborhood safer for all users, especially children walking to school and the new playground.
