Last week we learned about the heartbreaking discovery of the remains of 215 Indigenous children found at the former Tk'emlúps Indian Residential School. Our deepest and most sincere condolences go out to the families of the children and to all communities closely affected. The impact of this tragedy is vast, and our hearts are also with Indigenous students, families, and staff in the Burnaby School District. In difficult times, it is even more important to lift each other up and continue the healing journey together. We as a community wanted to hounour these lost children and have tied 215 ribbons on our fence to represent each of these children.

Class Placements: A Perspective on Friendships and Class placement

Please know that our staff members work together to thoughtfully place students in classes and when determining your child's placement, a variety of factors are considered. For example: the number of students in each class, academic and social strengths and needs, learning styles, friendships, a balance of boys and girls, special interests, and available support staff. We use our professional judgment, existing data, and engage in careful discussion as we create classes, keeping in mind the considerations listed above.

We do appreciate parent requests and use the added information to help shape class placements but I would like to be transparent about my views from over 20 years of teaching experience on a trend we noticed in parent requests - Requests to be with a group of friends. Friendship requests are one part of the loading process but only one part. We know students learn best when engaged, happy and enjoy coming to school and a portion of that is friends in the class. Teachers loading the classes know the students and will always try to put friends in the class or students who will potentially become a friend group.

A trend I have noticed which is not beneficial to our students is when they 'need' the same friend group from year to year. This is not possible and not beneficial for the development of our students. How did they become friends? Often it is from at one point, maybe Kindergarten, being in a class together and developing friendships. They need to continue to have these opportunities to develop friendships. In my opinion the biggest disappointment is when any student goes through their entire time at elementary school and did not have the chance to be in a class with every other student at that grade level. These are potentially missed friendships. So in brief we do look at friendships and friendship requests however we can not and will not always be able to honor these.
