Communicating Student Learning: Term 1

Schools in Burnaby, and across the province, are again participating in a pilot for communicating student learning in the first term of the 2021-2022 school year. The pilot meets the BC Ministry of Education reporting guidelines and achieves the goal of communicating learning so that parents are well informed of their child's progress.

In lieu of the typical first term report card, Lakeview students will receive a Learning Update. This Snapshot of Learning will have many of the components of a regular report card, however, this informal interim report will focus primarily on the <u>Core Competencies of</u> <u>the BC Curriculum</u>, which are foundational to all provincial curricula and to the development of the educated citizen.

The Snapshot of Learning will include:

- teacher feedback on your child's engagement, behavior and social development
- teacher feedback on your child's strengths in relation to grade level learning standards of Language Arts and Numeracy
- teacher feedback on areas for further development and ways to support learning

One difference to note between the Learning Update and a regular report card is that the Snapshot will focusing on only prioritized learning standards in Language Arts and Numeracy. Should a teacher have concerns with how your child is progressing academically, they will reach out to speak with you directly. Alternatively, parents always have the option of contacting their child's teacher with questions or to discuss concerns.

Parking and Drop-off reminders:

As anyone who drives to Lakeview knows parking and drop-off is tight around the school. Mayfield street is a tight, dead-end street and we are now also seeing parking difficulties below the lower playground at Berkley street.

Some reminders of rules to help with drop-off and pick-up:

- The drop-off area at the front of the school is only a drop-off and keep going area. You are not allowed to park in the turn around area and you may not get out of your car in this area. It is drop and go.
- The school parking lot is for Burnaby Staff only. No parking or pulling through the parking lot.
- Please do not stop in front of residence drive ways. They need access in and out and we have even seen someone park in front of a driveway
- If you can walk instead of driving please do so. In our catchment area about 80% of the students live within a 10 minute walk.
