Student-led conferences are on **Wednesday, March 9th**, there will be an **early dismissal at 2:00**. Student-led conferences are looking different in each class this year to reflect the unique and individualized ways that classrooms are documenting and communicating student learning.

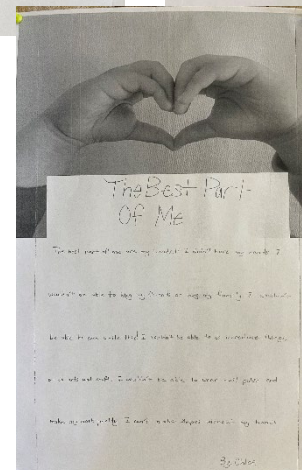
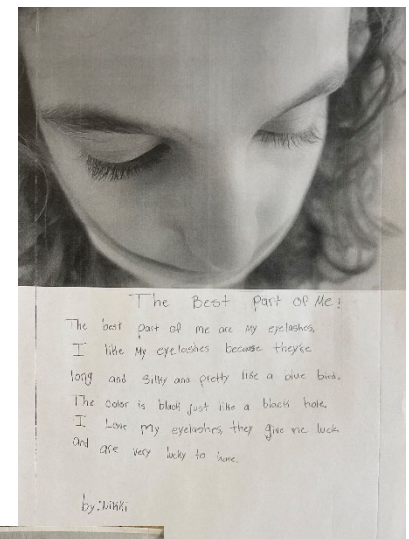
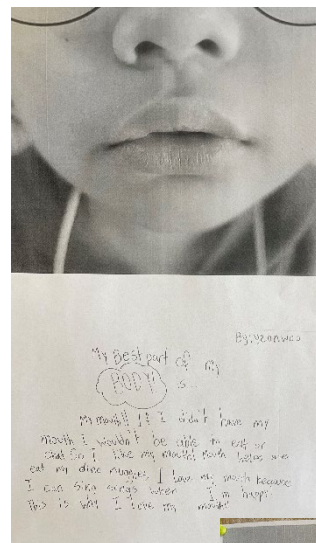
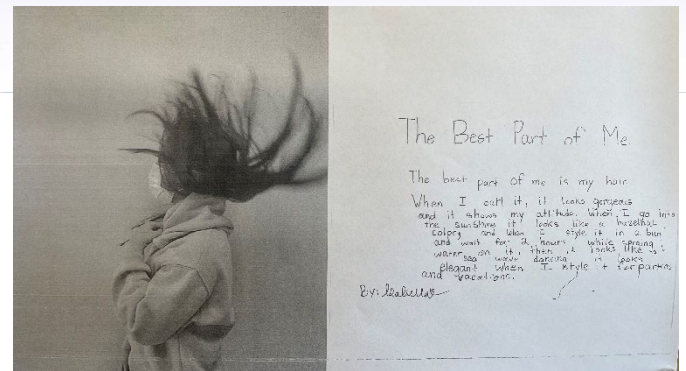
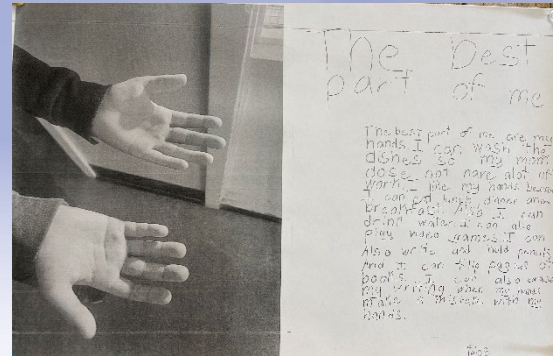
Student-led conferences are an important part of the reporting process even with them looking different than the traditional at school session. Your child(ren) will be bringing work home to share with you demonstrating progress in school activities to date. This is a proud time for your child as s/he takes a lead role in discussing learning achievements and areas for growth! The structure and format of the conferences will vary according to students' grade and the work that they have been doing in each classroom. Students may demonstrate their learning in a variety of ways. For example, they may show you portfolios, journal entries, reports, artwork or writing samples. Some of the materials you see during the conference may have been chosen by your child and some by your child's teacher. Often items are selected for a specific reason. The selections may not always be finished or the most polished piece of work but might demonstrate growth or an area of improvement.

Our students are excited about sharing their knowledge and their ability to be reflective thinkers. We ask that you listen, ask questions and encourage your child in this reflective process. Self-evaluation is key to becoming a life-long learner – a goal we have for all of our students. A Growth Mindset.

To facilitate a successful experience, we suggest:

- allowing your child to lead the conference
- listening carefully
- commenting positively on your child's achievements and progress
- asking the teacher for a meeting at another time if you would like to speak with her about specific concerns

Thank you to all the families that ordered hot lunch in our second term and we encourage all families to try the Lakeview Hot Lunch fundraiser. Our hot lunch program is the schools main fundraiser for the year and it is the support of all the families at Lakeview that make this program such a success.

We are excited to announce this term we are going to have a special "treat day" that is TCBY frozen yogurt and sorbet. For our final term the vendors are Cobbs Bakery, Booster Juice, Boston Pizza (pasta), Subway, White Spot, Wok Box, and Pizza Hut. Please remember for Subway to add toppings at the end of your session when prompted.

We are once again offering sushi and you will notice an increase to some of the prices. We have had to increase our prices as our previous vendor changed ownership and the new owners aren't offering the same pricing. The previous owner offered our school a very generous discount that the prices were below market. We will be switching to Fresh Box sushi as the pricing with this vendor is closer to our current prices.

Sadly, we have had to discontinue offering milk as Saputo no longer has a driver for our route and is unable at this time to advise when or if they will have a driver for our route. We apologize for the inconvenience and hope we can offer milk for the next school year.
