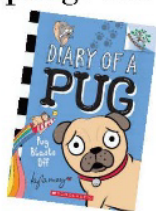

Chapter Book Challenge 2022!

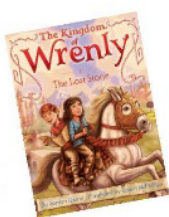

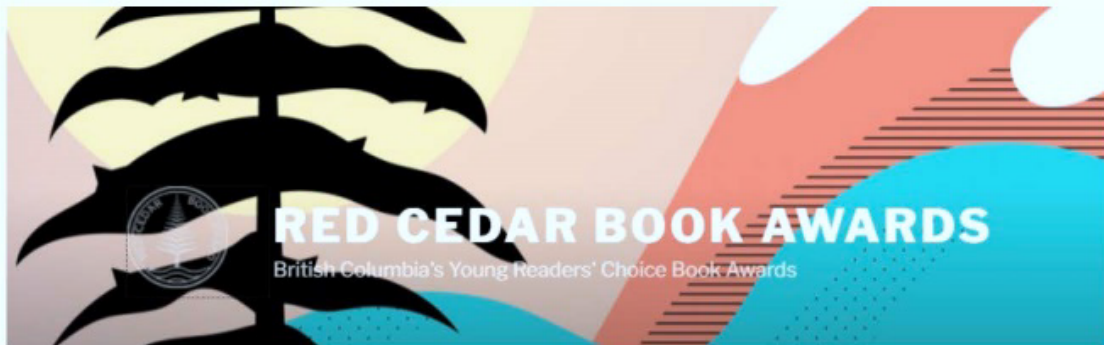
