## Community Reader Event

The classrooms at Lakeview were excited to host a range of Community Members for the Community Reading Event.

We had a Regional Parks Interpretation specialist share stories about beavers paired with puppets and artifacts, the RCMP had three representatives, and the Fire Department sent a team complete with a firetruck for the Kindergarten students to explore. There were three Pacific Assistance Dogs present, with a hope to return for future dates. Felicia with her son Tanner, focusing on inclusion and accessibility. A substantial construction crew came from Turner Construction. School Trustee Peter Cech and Burnaby Council Member Maita Santiago also joined us with reading to two classes as well. We had Indigenous Education representatives and our Safe School Specialist from Burnaby Central join intermediate groups. Last, but certainly not least, we had some special teacher and retired Principal guests with Ms. Douglas, Mr. Kanno, Ms. Suh, and Ms. Brophy lighting up the rooms.

The students were abuzz with excitement after our guests left on Thursday. They swapped stories with their peers over the course of the day and were keen to share experiences with me during their library visits. The books that were read aloud to the classes flew off of the shelves, with several requests pending!


## Library Update!

We have had a busy start to our New Year in the library with 3182 books circulating already in 2023! That's 200 every day that the library is open... which makes it feel like an exciting place to be! Book displays, so far this year, have highlighted Black Excellence, Lunar New Yar, and are currently focused on Kindness. Over 100 books were circulated from our Black Excellence display in the last three weeks, which continues to be featured for Black History Month.
Over the past week our library sessions centred on Indigenous Land Acknowledgements. We explored the significance of Burnaby in the past and present with our local Indigenous Communities, the $\mathrm{x}^{\mathrm{w}} \mathrm{m} \partial \mathrm{k}^{\mathrm{w}} \partial$ y'm $^{2}$ (Musqueam), Skwxwú 7 mesh (Squamish), and solilwatal (Tsleil-Waututh). This was a Kindergarten - Grade 7 lesson, so feel free to ask your child what they remember from the lesson and if they can share a route that was used by Indigenous peoples for hundreds of years that is now a main street in Burnaby, or if they can locate Lakeview on this map. A big shout-out to the students in the school that could identify where Lakeview was on the map: Nina (Gr 2), Krishnav (Gr 2), Carson (Gr 2), and Rylan ( Gr 3 ), Lorelei ( Gr 5 ).


A few more updates from the library includes our books on hold and new books acquired. My jaw dropped in preparing these numbers as I realized we have 189 holds pending, so a big thank-you to students, parents, and Teachers for reminding students to return books on time and early if they are finished with them (particularly with popular titles). I am also busy getting new books onto the shelves with 80 new books in the final stages of processing (laminating, stickering, cataloguing) to be added to the shelves in the next week.
