Student-led conferences are looking different in each class this year to reflect the unique and individualized ways that classrooms are documenting and communicating student learning.

Student-led conferences are an important part of the reporting process and is another key point of contact. This is a proud time for your child as they take a lead role in discussing learning achievements and areas for growth! The structure and format of the conferences will vary according to students' grade and the work that they have been doing in each classroom. Students may demonstrate their learning in a variety of ways. For example, they may show you portfolios, journal entries, reports, artwork or writing samples. Some of the materials you see during the conference may have been chosen by your child and some by your child's teacher. Often items are selected for a specific reason. The selections may not always be finished or the most polished piece of work but might demonstrate growth or an area of improvement.
