February Registration & Student Opportunities

Please see the below information regarding registration during the month of February, as well as how to learn about the unique program opportunities for students in the Burnaby School District, which are also available for application in February.

Registration

February is registration month in Burnaby Schools for the next school year. Register in February if your student:

- 1. is starting Kindergarten in the 2024-25 school year
- 2. will be new (all grades) to the Burnaby School District in the 2024-25 school year

Apply in February

Apply anytime in February to be considered for priority placement for the 2024-25 school year if your student:

1. would like to apply for French Immersion, Mandarin Language Arts or any of the other **Elementary Programs of Choice**

2. is going into Grade 8 next year and wants to attend a school other than the home school for their catchment / attendance area (cross-district transfer)

Kindly note that current Grade 7s who attend a Burnaby School District elementary school do not need to apply in February *unless* they are wanting to attend a high school that is outside of their catchment / attendance area.

Opportunities for Students at High School

As you consider your child's interests, we want to make you aware of the many choices for students going into Grades 8-12. In addition to course electives, all eight of our high schools offer what's called <u>Programs</u> of <u>Choice</u>. Learning options include technology, sports academies, trades, career training, and educational enrichment such as Advanced Placement. Some Career Education options even allow students to earn wages along with credits toward graduation.

BC Ministry of Education and Child Care: Student Learning Survey

The 2023/24 Student Learning Survey (SLS) for students in Grades 4, 7, 10 and 12, as well as parents, staff and principals/vice-principals is now open and available until May 3, 2024. The SLS provides feedback on the implementation of the curriculum changes, learning environment, student wellness and satisfaction, student belonging and engagement, and career preparation. The SLS is the only source of province-wide information about students' learning experiences through the perspectives of students, parents, guardians/caregivers, and school staff. Schools and districts use the SLS to make informed decisions around long-term planning and goal setting, and in providing individual students personalized support. The student and staff surveys are available in English and French, and the parent survey is available in 18 languages.
