Thank you to those families who attended Monday evening's presentation on "Healthy Peer Relationships". Suzanne started by explaining the foundations of social emotional learning (SEL) and how this looks throughout child development.

SEL is the process through which all young people and adults acquire and apply the knowledge, skills, and attitudes to develop healthy identities, manage emotions and achieve personal and collective goals, feel and show empathy for others, establish and maintain supportive relationships, and make responsible and caring decisions.

Children develop SEL skills through many different avenues: observation, direct teaching, play, and generally experiencing the world around them. In school we support students by teaching and modeling a variety of skills; some of these skills include identifying emotions, implementing a calm down strategy, communicating in respectful ways with peers, playing safely, and teaching how to solve problems in peaceful ways (conflict resolution). 













Community Opportunity
