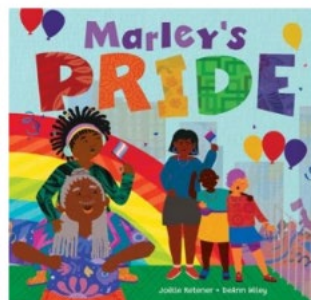
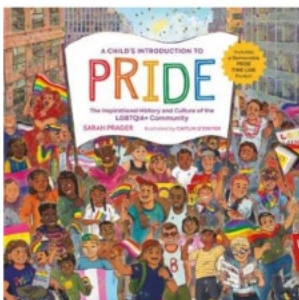
Lakeview Elementary Weekly News
