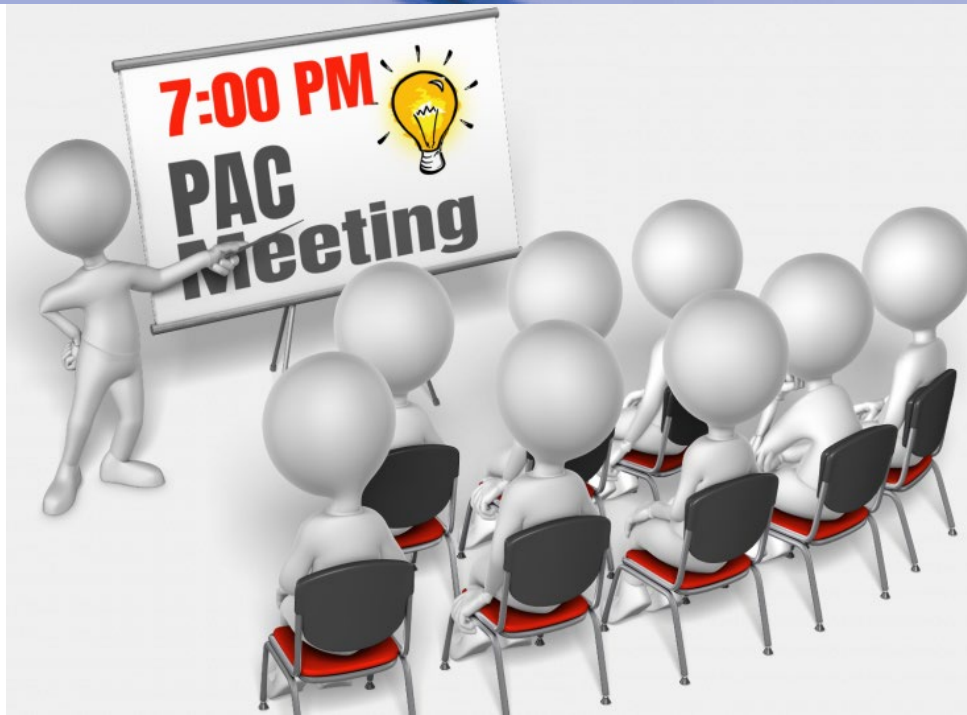


Lakeview Run Club Update: Sign Up Friday, October 18th
