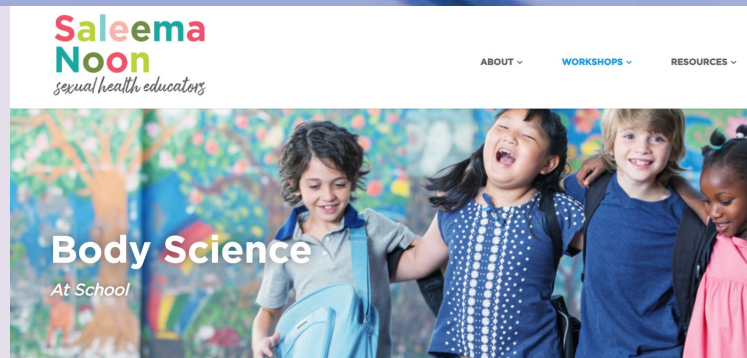

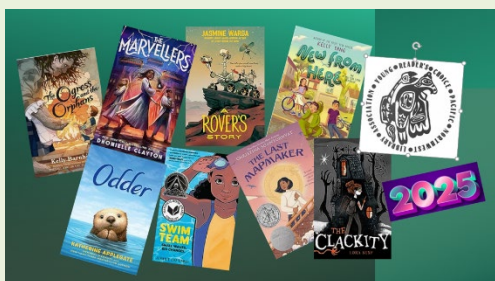
Wow, thank you so much for all your messages, cards, emails, texts and conversations regarding Mary Poppins!

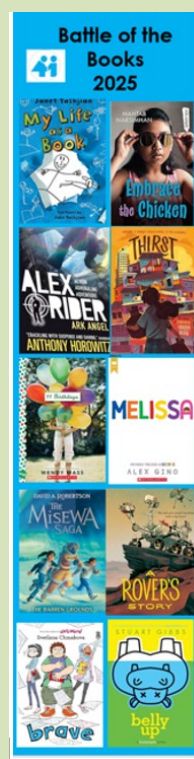
