National Indigenous History Month Moments



1. Did you know that the Eagle represents balance, strength, vision, and spirituality to the Coast Salish people? The Eagles fly highest in the sky and are closest to the Creator! The eagle will part of our Scavenger Hunt at Lunch this Monday!

Our Indigenous Language for the day is the Hul'q'umi'num' word for thank-you which is "huychq'u" and is often paired with raising our hands to person you are thanking as a customary way to show respect and appreciation, echoing the gratitude

2. Did you know that the Owl is a keeper of sacred knowledge to the Coast Salish peoples and that Owls are messengers of change and guides to the Spirit World?

Our Indigenous Language for the day is the Squamish word for Raven which is Skeekw.

3. Did you know that the goose represents determination, faithfulness, and loyalty to the Coast Salish peoples and that Geese are recognized for being silly and funny! They love family and always work as a team!

Student Experience in Learning, Belonging, and Reconciliation

Students visited the Burnaby School District office. A special thank you to Rob Smyth (District Principal of Indigenous Education) for leading the group in the Greeting of the Day, for sharing teachings on the cultural and spiritual significance of Cedar to the Musqueam, Squamish, and Tsleil-Waututh Nations, and for creating a welcoming space through leading us in circle. We are especially grateful for the opportunity to learn about the rich artistic traditions of the local Nations and the teachings communicated to the Burnaby School District and the learners, through the artwork. Students spent time learning about the Welcome Figure by Squamish carver Xwalacktun, the Coast Salish Weaving by Angela George (qwanat) from the Tsleil-Waututh Nation, and the art prints in the foyer from Musqueam artists. The artwork and stories shared with us helped our students build a deeper understanding of Indigenous knowledge, but also the commitment of the Burnaby School District to the local Nations, Indigenous Learners within the learning communities, and reconciliation.
