

Please Bring to School:



- 1. Healthy Lunch and Snacks
- 2. Water Bottle
- 3. Running Shoes (primary students should have indoor running shoes, preferably without laces)
- 4. Change of clothes in Ziploc for primary students
- 5. pencil box with basic supplies: pencil, eraser, pencil crayons, a glue stick and scissors

Students should not bring all their school supplies until they are assigned to their permanent classrooms. At the end of this newsletter, you will see copies of the supply lists for your reference. Please note, Kindergarten families will be asked to contribute \$35 to shared school supplies for the year. The kindergarten teachers will do the shopping and manage the supplies throughout the year. The fee will be collected online through school cash online in September.



Parking and drop-off is tight around the school. Mayfield street is a tight, dead-end street and we also seeing parking difficulties below the lower playground at Berkley Street.

If you can walk instead of driving, please do so. In our catchment area about 80% of the students live within a ten-minute walk. Please considering walking instead of driving. Some reminders of rules to help with drop-off and pick-up:

- **Safety First:** Please adhere to all traffic rules and designated drop-off zones. Ensure that your child exits and enters the vehicle safely, using designated crosswalks and sidewalks.
 - The drop-off area at the front of the school is only a drop-off and keep going area. Please do not park in the turn around area. Please do not get out of your car in this area. It is drop and go.
- **Mindful Parking:** Be considerate when parking or waiting in designated areas. Avoid blocking traffic or creating unsafe conditions for pedestrians.
 - The school parking lot is for Burnaby School District Staff only. Please do not park or pull through the parking lot.
 - Please be mindful of driveways in the neighbourhood. Our neighbours need access in and out of their driveway, so do not block the driveways.
- **Patience is Key:** Drop-off and pick-up times can be hectic, but practicing patience is crucial. Give yourself and others the time needed to safely drop off or pick up their children.
- **Carpooling Coordination:** If you are part of a carpool, coordinate with other parents to streamline the drop-off and pick-up process. Communication can help reduce congestion and waiting times.
- **Kindness Matters:** Remember, we're all in this together. Kindness goes a long way, especially during busy times. Extend a friendly gesture or a smile to other parents and drivers.

Let's work together to ensure our school community remains a positive and nurturing environment for our children. Thank you for your cooperation and commitment to the well-being of our students.

This list represents the basic supply list of materials needed in the Intermediate Grades 4 – 7.

Additional items may be requested by individual teachers in September.

- 2. 3 soft **white** erasers (bring one to school)
- 3. 1 pencil sharpener (with container to catch shavings)
- 4. 2 blue or black ballpoint pens
- 5. 2 red ballpoint pens
- 6. 1 package of fine tip felt markers
- 7. 3 black Sharpies
- 8. 3 black extra fine pens (fine-liner)
- 9. 3 glue sticks (40g, not coloured one per term)
- 10. 1 set of pencil crayons (24 colours, pre-sharpened)
- 11. 2 standout highlighters
- 12. 1 pair of **pointed** 7" scissors
- 13. 3 **clear** plastic rulers (30 cm long, marked in mm) not flexible
- 14. 150 200 pages of 3 holed ruled paper
- 15. 1 plastic supply box (no bigger than a Girl Guide Cookie Box)
- 16. 1 box of tissues (for class use throughout the year)
- 17. 1 math set (compass and protractor) Grades 5, 6 & 7 only
- 18. 4 one-inch binders (maximum 1 inch thick)
- 19. 1 package of index dividers (assorted colours, 8 per package)
- 20. 1 package of graph paper (Grades 4/5)
- 21. 2 packages of graph paper (Grades 6/7)
- 22. 1 package of oil pastels
- 23. 1 basic calculator
- 24. 4 dry erase markers
- 25. 1 duotang

Intermediate students are required to change for PE classes for personal hygiene and safety reasons; therefore, students will need the following which will be kept at the school.

- 1. 1 t-shirt and 1 pair of shorts

- 1. 4 dry erase markers
- 2. 24 pack of HB pencils (no mechanical pencils)
- 3. 1 pencil sharpener (with container to catch shavings)
- 4. 4 soft **white** erasers
- 5. 6 large (40g) glue sticks (not small)
- 6. 1 bottle of white glue
- 7. 1 set of pencil crayons 12 or 24
- 8. 1 set of wax crayons 12 or 24 (no more than 24)
- 9. 1 set of markers 12 or 24
- 10. 1 pair of metal scissors
- 11. 2 ultra-fine Sharpies (fine liner)
- 12. 2 fine Sharpies
- 13. 1 highlighter
- 14. 1 30cm ruler (metric)
- 15. 1 box of tissues
- 16. Pencil Box/Pouch/Container to hold loose school suppliers must fit into student's desk (no more than 9cm high)
- 17. 12 duo-tangs in a variety of colours (paper, NOT plastic and they must have 3 prongs to hold 3-hole paper). **NO NAME ON THEM,** please.

Please send a pair of inside shoes/runners to be kept at the school for gym and rainy days.

Please send a change of clothes for your child to keep at school. (In a Ziploc bag, labelled with their name).

Back to school health and virtual care

Tips for a healthy back to school season

As children head back to school, parents face the familiar challenge of managing busy schedules, school routines and inevitably, health concerns.

Staying healthy during the school year isn't just about routines—it's also about protecting children from illnesses that can spread quickly in classrooms. An important preventable illness to be aware of right now is **measles**, which has been increasing globally, including here in Canada. Symptoms of measles include fever, cough, runny nose and red, inflamed eyes, followed by a rash. The rash usually starts on the face and neck and spreads to the chest, arms and legs.

Get vaccinated against measles

Immunization is the best way to prevent measles infection. Please check that you (if born in or after 1970) and your children have received at least two doses of a measles-containing vaccine. Find out how to check your immunization records here.

Measles-containing vaccines are available at many <u>pharmacy locations</u>, physician offices and at all <u>public</u> health units.

If your children have symptoms of measles, please keep them home.

If you or your child needs urgent care for something like a high fever, please inform your health care provider before you visit so they can take steps to prevent the spread of measles. Wear a mask and avoid using public transportation.
