Elder Alroy (Bucky) Baker also focused on the importance of connection, families, and community within our schools, reminding us of how to honour our Learning Communities and families. He encourages us to view schools as homes and to see each other as relatives taking care of each other. 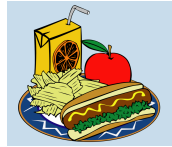
