Dear Lakeview Community,

As our school year continues, we want to remind families about the importance of safe and considerate travel around the school. Parking and drop-off areas are especially tight—both on Mayfield Street, which is a narrow dead-end, and along Berkley Street below the lower playground. Whenever possible, please consider walking instead of driving.

To support smooth and safe drop-off and pick-up, please keep the following guidelines in mind:

Safety First: Follow all traffic rules and use only designated drop-off zones. Ensure children use crosswalks and sidewalks. The front drop-off loop is *drop-and-go only*. Please do not park, stop for extended periods, or exit your vehicle in this area.

Mindful Parking: Park considerately to avoid blocking traffic or creating unsafe conditions for pedestrians. The school parking lot is reserved for Burnaby School District staff—please do not use it for parking or drive-through access. Be mindful of our neighbours by keeping driveways clear at all times.

Patience is Key: We know these times can be busy. A little patience helps everyone start and end their day more calmly and safely.

Kindness Matters: A friendly wave or smile goes a long way. We appreciate everyone working together to keep our community welcoming and safe.

Thank you for helping us maintain a positive and safe environment for all.

Nikkei Centre Connection – Museum in the Library

In our Library this week, Intermediate students were introduced to the history of Japanese Canadian internment through partnership and support with the Nikkei Centre. In small groups, students examine selected artifact replicas, documents, and images, using guiding questions to make connections and understand the symbolic significance of these items. The lesson focused on building historical understanding, empathy, and inquiry skills within a short, interactive timeframe. Ask your child what artifact they studied, and what facts resonate with them.
