Indigenous Peoples Day – Student Readers

National Indigenous Peoples Day

Sunday, June 21st is National Indigenous Peoples Day. This day holds immense significance as it recognizes and honours the rich heritage, diverse cultures, and invaluable contributions of First Nations, Inuit, and Métis peoples across Canada.

The date June 21 aligns with the summer solstice, the longest day of the year, which has been celebrated by Indigenous groups for generations. It's a time to come together, learn, and appreciate the wisdom, art, and resilience of Indigenous people across Canada.

This week student leaders visited classes to read different Indigenous stories to them. Students shared a range of stories from Indigenous people across Canada.

Next week, we will recognize Indigenous Peoples Day on Monday, June 22nd. In the morning, we will have an announcement about “Greeting of the Day” and teachers will play the song in their classrooms that morning. Students are invited to share how the song made them feel and reflect on what helps them have a good day.

In recognition of National Indigenous Peoples Day, we are proud to highlight our Indigenous Peoples Collection (IPC), which showcases books written with authentic Indigenous voice; stories created by Indigenous authors that reflect their lived experiences, cultures, and perspectives.

Our IPC continues to grow and connect with readers:

- 📖 223 books in the collection
- + 16 new titles added this year
- 📄 462 checkouts this year (up from 303 last year)

These numbers reflect a growing interest in and appreciation for Indigenous stories within our school community. We invite everyone to explore the IPC collection and engage with these important voices.

Division 8 Potato Harvest



Division 8 had a successful potato harvest on Thursday morning. The students harvested 148 potatoes and enjoyed the fruits of their labour with a delicious potato party. Many students came up for second and third helpings. This hands-on gardening activity teaches children where food comes from, the science of plant growth, and the reward of eating a meal from scratch. The students participated in the “Spuds in the Tubs” program from March to June. They planted seed potatoes from sprouted tubers in tubs of soil all the way to harvesting and enjoying a delicious, healthy snack.

Parent/Caregiver Accounts in the MyEducationBC Family Portal

Lakeview Elementary Family Portal Update

We are pleased to announce that Lakeview Elementary will be creating parent/caregiver accounts for the MyEducation BC (MyEdBC) Family Portal. These accounts will provide parents and caregivers with secure access to important educational information about their child, including learning updates (report cards), attendance records, and demographic details.

Previously, you may have accessed the Family Portal using your child's account login information. If you have another child currently enrolled in a Burnaby high school, you should already have a parent/caregiver account, which you can now use to access your child's information.

Benefits of the MyEdBC Family Portal Parent Accounts

- **Easy Access to Learning Updates (Report Cards):** Parents/Caregivers can quickly and conveniently view their child's report card.
- **Enhanced Privacy and Security:** Learning Updates (Report Cards) and other information are stored on a secure web server, eliminating for paper copies or email distribution.
- **Update Expired or Forgotten Passwords:** Parents/Caregivers can reset or change their password themselves if it is forgotten or expired
- **Forgotten login ID:** Parents/Caregivers can retrieve their login ID themselves if it is forgotten

Getting an Account

If you don't already have a parent/caregiver account to the Family Portal, you will receive an email from your child's school with login details, (The MyED system will generate and email out the login ID) including a username and temporary password. To ensure you receive this email, please add **sysadmin@myeducation.gov.bc.ca** to your email address book to prevent it from being flagged as spam. (Check your junk/spam/promotions folder in case you don't receive it, otherwise follow up by contacting the school office)

The email will look similar to the following:

Welcome to the Burnaby School District MyEducation BC FAMILY PORTAL, which provides access to your child's educational information.

To Access the MyEducation BC System:

- Visit <https://myeducation.gov.bc.ca/aspen/logon.do>
- Ensure popups are enabled on your browser.
- Your username will generally be your first and last name (e.g., johnsmith).
- Your temporary password will be system-generated.

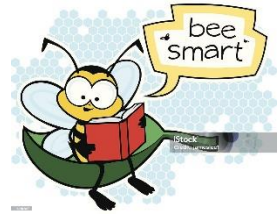

Primary School Supply List
2026 - 2027



This list represents the basic supply list of materials needed in the Primary grades 1 - 3. All supplies are to be kept in good working order and may need to be replenished during the school year. The following list includes enough supplies to last a good part of the school year. **Additional items may be requested by individual teachers in September.**

Supply List for all Primary Grades:

1. 4 dry erase markers (chisel tip)
2. 24 pack of HB pencils (no mechanical pencils)
3. 1 pencil sharpener (with container to catch shavings)
4. 4 soft **white** erasers
5. 6 **large** (40g) glue sticks (not small)
6. 1 bottle of white glue
7. 1 set of pencil crayons 12 or 24
8. 1 set of wax crayons 12 or 24 (no more than 24)
9. 1 set of markers 12 or 24
10. 1 pair of metal scissors
11. 2 ultra-fine Sharpies (fine liner)
12. 2 fine Sharpies
13. 1 highlighter
14. 1 – 30cm ruler (metric)
15. 1 box of tissues
16. Pencil Box/Pouch/Container to hold loose school suppliers – must fit into student's desk (no more than 9cm high)
17. 12 duo-tangs in a variety of colours (paper, NOT plastic and they must have 3 prongs to hold 3-hole paper). **NO NAME ON THEM**, please.

ALL supplies need to be labelled with your child's name or initials, except for the duo tangs. (Please label each crayon in the set).

Please send a pair of inside shoes/runners (labelled with child's name) to be kept at the school for gym and rainy days.

Please send a change of clothes for your child to keep at school. (In a Ziploc bag, labelled with their name).

Please do not purchase an individual student planner. This will be available for purchase through School Cash Online in September 2026.

10. 1 set of pencil crayons (24 colours, pre-sharpened)
11. 2 standout highlighters
12. 1 pair of **pointed** 7" scissors
13. 3 **clear** plastic rulers (30 cm long, marked in mm)
14. 150 – 200 pages of 3 holed ruled paper
15. 1 plastic supply box (no bigger than a Girl Guide Cookie Box)
16. 1 **box** of tissues (for class use throughout the year)
17. 1 math set (compass and protractor) – **Grades 5, 6 & 7 only**
18. 5 one-inch binders (**maximum 1 inch thick**)
19. 1 package of index dividers (assorted colours, 8 per package)
- 20.** 1 package of graph paper
21. 1 package of oil pastels
22. 1 basic calculator
23. 6 dry erase markers
24. 1 liquid glue
25. 1 watercolour paint set
26. 1 box medium sized ziplock bags
